Best practices

1. Showing of Examination Scripts to Students Prior to Publication of Results:

The practice of showing the students their answer scripts after correction was begun by most of the Departments from the beginning in 2009. Most teachers welcomed this practice as one that would go a long way towards solving the problems of nepotism and as one that would diffuse the aura of fear and mystery that surrounded the examination system. The feature is largely unique in our country as very few institutions, apart from the Indian Institutes of Management and a few Departments in the Indian Institutes of Technology follow this practice. No other University in West Bengal, to our knowledge, follows this practice.

2. Ensuring that students are involved in curricular and extra-curricular activities oriented towards local needs and addressed towards local problems:

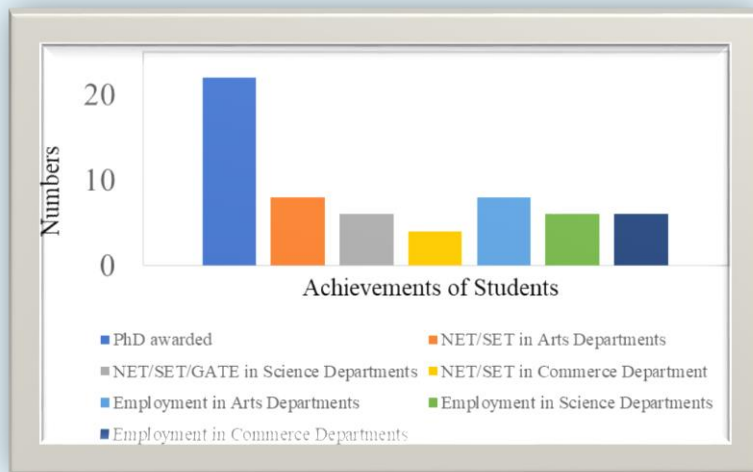
In our country, curricula in most HEIs are often dissociated from local realities. The constraints/ limitations for any University implementing this practice would be: old and outdated curricula, dominance of theoretical knowledge which makes the syllabi intractable for application-oriented study, and, conversely, the risk of over-emphasising the local and losing sight of the larger, global picture. In order to overcome these constraints/limitations, we have worked out the practice in the following ways

3. Ensuring that Students are oriented towards job-oriented coaching such as NET/SET in most of the Departments

The Departments such as Economics, Education, Rural Studies regularly organize special classes for NET/SET examination. Some Departments also organize seminar/workshop on administrative and/or corporate job opportunities specific to their subjects .

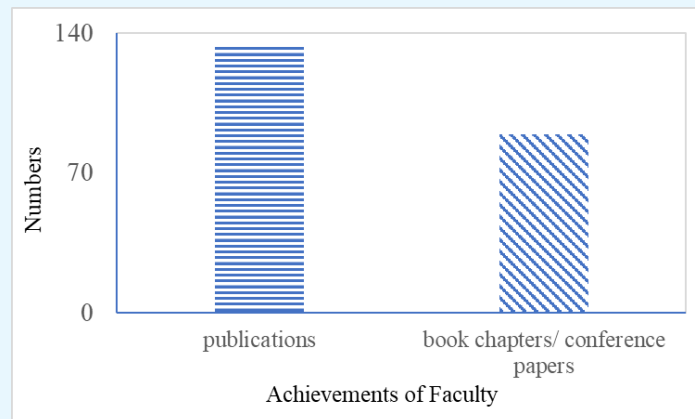

আচার্য প্রফুল্লচন্দ্র কলেজের প্রোগ্রাম অফিসার ড. সুমিত্রা বিশ্বাস, এনএসএস কোষাধ্যক্ষ সুবাসন্তি দে ও আরো অনেকে। প্রসঙ্গত বলা দরকার, উপাচার্য মহুয়া দাস বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের দায়িত্ব নেওয়ার পর থেকে এখানে নানা সমাজসেবামূলক কাজের জোয়ার এসেছে।

এসব কাজের মধ্যে দুই বছর ছাত্রীলের সাহায্য করা, বৃক্ষরোপণ ও খেলাধুলোয় উসোহ লেগেয়ার সঙ্গে সতে ছাত্রছাত্রীলের কর্মমুখী করে তোলা, লেখাপড়ার পাশাপাশি দ্বিভাষিক ট্রেনিংয়ে উৎসাহিত করা আর অতিমারির সময় নানাভাবে মানুষের পাশে থাকা এর মধ্যে

উল্লেখযোগ্য। তার স্বীকৃতি হিসাবে পশ্চিমবঙ্গ সেন রাজ্যের শিক্ষামন্ত্রী অধ্যাপক ব্রজেন বসু ও শিক্ষাসচিব মনীষ জৈন।

পশ্চিমবঙ্গ রাষ্ট্রীয় বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের উপাচার্য মহুয়া দাস জানান, ২০০৯ সালে রাজ্য সরকারের রাজ্য জনসংস্পর্ক সেল, এই বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ে জাতীয় সেবা প্রকল্প কর্মসূচির অনুমোদন হয়ে। বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের অধীনে ২৫টা কলেজ ও বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের নিজস্ব ২৭টা ইউনিট রয়েছে, যা আগে ছিল অসংকতো বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের। সব ইউনিট মিলে মোট ২৫০০ কোর্সেসেক কাজ করছে। ইউনিটের সংখ্যা বাড়ানোর পাশাপাশি তাঁদের প্রশংসিত মনও বাড়ানো হয়েছে। এইসব কোর্সেসেকেরা সমাজের উন্নয়নে কাজ করে চলেছে। এঁদের কাজের মধ্যে রয়েছে টিকাদান অভিযান, রক্তদান পিবির, স্থানীয় ফুটবল মলকে অনুপ্রাণিত করা, ফেজিড ও আশ্রম প্রভৃতিত এলাকার সাহায্য করা, স্থানীয় শিশুদের শিক্ষামূলক কিট লেভো প্রভৃতি। এই বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়কে একটা গ্রামীণ বিশ্ববিদ্যালয় হিসাবে গড়ে তোলার সব ধরনের পরিকল্পনায় ও সুযোগ-সুবিধা রয়েছে।

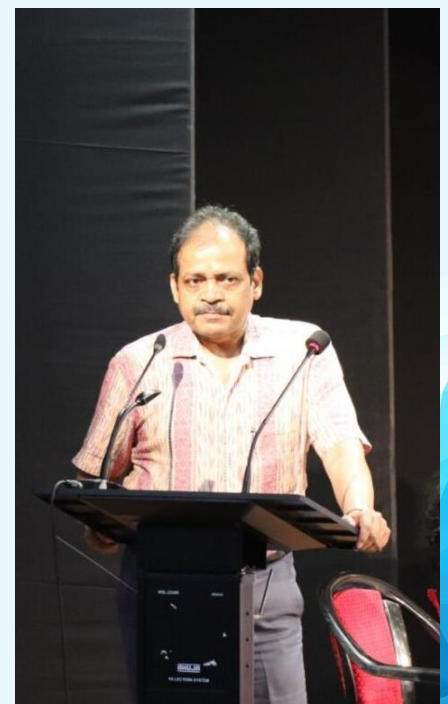
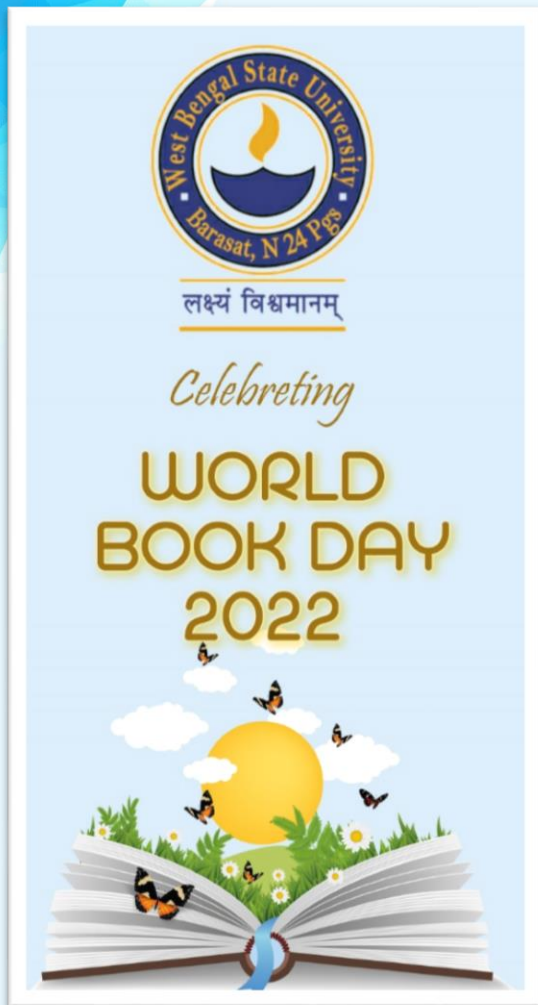

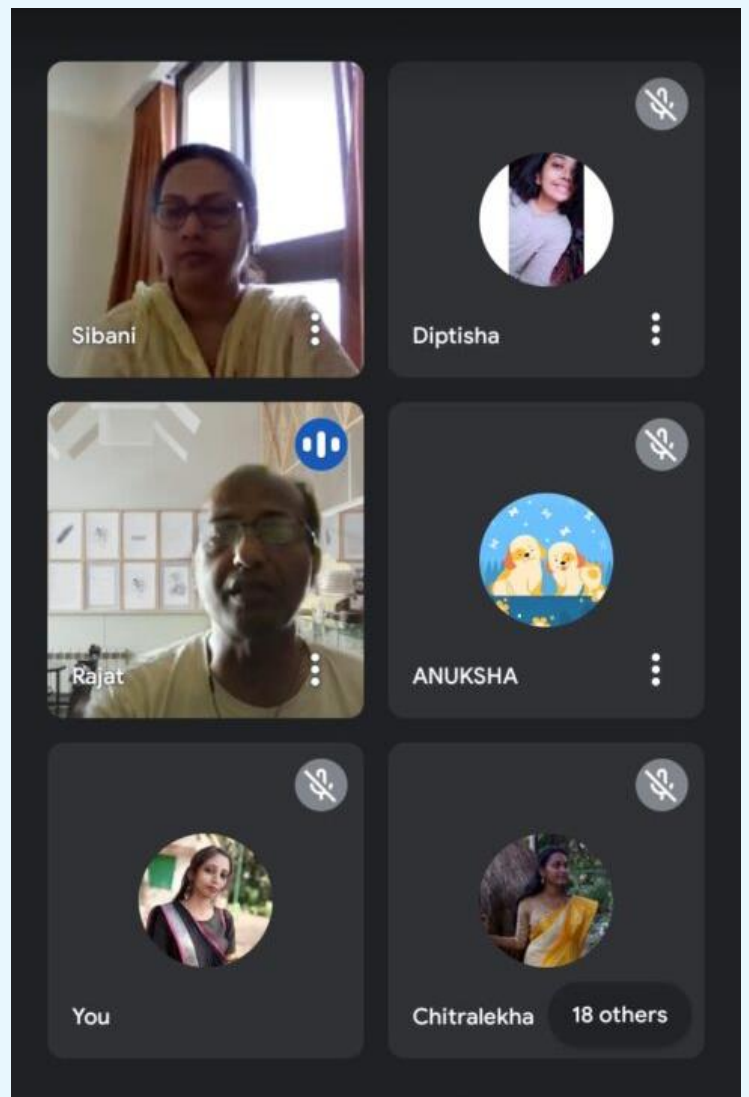

Biostatistics

- ❑ Biostatistics can also be known as science of variation.
 - Summarize a characteristics for sample or for a population.
- ❑ Variation in a characteristics occurs when its value changes from subject to subject, or from time to time or instrument to instrument or observer to observer within the same subject.
- ❑ For example, variation in blood pressure from person to person, morning to evening, before and after physical exercise, in sitting and supine positions, and in different measuring instruments.
- ❑ These variation measure require that appropriate methods to be used:
 - Decide for a particular characteristics, the normal or average.
 - Compare two samples or two population with respect to a particular characteristics.
- ❑ It is thus necessary to be conversant with the proper statistical methods i.e., Biostatistics for dealing with measure such variations and uncertainties.
